



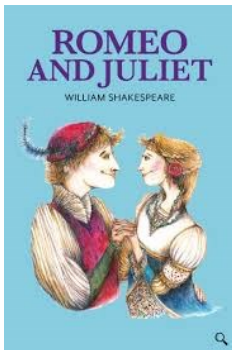
Redbourn Reading Round Up 3
