

Curriculum Map Year 1 Spring Term 2025

English

Texts we will be using: The Comet, Leo and the Octopus, Stanley's Stick, The Sea Saw

Key Learning:

- Application of phonic knowledge
- Write simple sentences for different purposes (letter, diary, narrative etc)
- Use of 'and' to extend sentences
- Consistent and correct use of capital letters, full stops and question marks
- Adjectives to add detail

Key Vocabulary: verb, adjective, noun, punctuation, question, command, statement

Class reader(s): Oak- The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark. Beech- The Twits **At home you can:** Hear your child read/read to them x 5 per week. Practise spellings

Maths

Key Learning:

- Place value (within 20) counting, ordering, comparing numbers, one more, one less
- Addition and subtraction (within 20)- using + and symbols, making number bonds, counting back, finding the difference
- Place Value (within 50) counting skills, grouping, partitioning, estimating (in tens), using number lines
- Length and height measuring objects, introduction to cm
- Mass and volume measure and compare mass and volume

Key Vocabulary: Numbers to 50, add, subtract, equals, height, length, mass, volume

At home you can: Practise counting skills – forwards and backwards, one more, one less, counting in multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s

Science

Key Learning:
