Nursery Visits

We are so pleased to welcome you today, and to offer you and your child the chance to look around our indoor and outdoor environments prior to your child joining us in September.





Induction Process

Home Visits

Before your child joins us in Nursery we aim to visit every child at home.

This really helps your child to get to know us a little bit so that we don't seem like strangers and means that we can talk about our memories of the visit when they start.

It also provides a really valuable opportunity for you to share information with us about your child so that we can offer them the best support possible as they start their school career.

Home visits will take place on the **first week of term, 4th and 5th September 2025.**

Pre-School Experience

As well as conducting home visits, we make an effort each year to visit our main pre-school providers before the end of the Summer term.

If we are unable to visit, we try to make contact with providers over the phone. If you haven't already, please do let the office know if your child is attending a pre-school or Nursery and which one it is, so that we can include them in our outreach work.





Induction Process



Starting at Nursery

Following your home visit, your child will be invited to come in for a **one hour morning** visit with you or another family member (just one adult please) on **8th September or 9th September 1.30-2.30pm.**

This is so that your child has the opportunity to re-visit Nursery and find out about the welcome routines etc in a small group before they stay for the full session. We ask that the adult who brings your child stays for the first part, then leaves to have a quick coffee and a chat with the other parents and to meet the Headteacher. It would be really helpful if you could talk to your child before they come and explain to them what will be happening, in really positive terms. We hope the children will be excited to visit us!



Key Transition Dates:

- September 2025
- Week 1 of term: (Thurs 4th and Fri 5th September) Home visits
- Week 2 of term: (Mon 8th and Tues 9th September) 1 hour afternoon visit to school 1.30-2.30pm
- Week 2 of term: (Wed 10th -Fri 12th September) Mornings only (8.40-11.40am)—no Treetops hours
- Week 3 of term: (Week beginning 15th September) Fulltime allocation of hours and Treetops
- October: Fulltime allocation of hours, Treetops and Lunch Club

Please bring your child to the Nursery classroom door, via the perimeter and Nursery gates (as shown). Please be punctual as the Nursery door is closed promptly at 8.50am and any children arriving after this time will need to report to the School Office.

Please come up to the Nursery door with your child...but we ask that you say goodbye there and make the separation as quickly and positively as possible. It is the actual separation children find difficult and it is rare for them not to settle within a few minutes of this happening.

If they don't settle, we will always contact you, and work with you, to find the best way of settling your child in. We have found that the cloakroom becomes extremely crowded if parents come in with their children and it can be overwhelming for them.

Our Treetops Club, where children stay all day, will begin on Monday 15th September.



A note on attendance

Once your child has completed their induction, we expect that they attend every session, every day, unless too ill to do so. Good attendance is recognised as a key factor in settling in, emotional and academic success at school.

Being in school every day:

- allows children to build strong and lasting friendships
- helps children feel part of a team, developing confidence and a sense of belonging
- ensures children are exposed to a complete sequence of learning: missing a day means a gap in their knowledge and exposure to a topic.
- forms good habits for future school years and in to working life.

We ask that you:

- avoid booking routine medical/dental/hair appointments during a Nursery session
- bring your child to Nursery even when other siblings are home unwell
- avoid booking holidays or trips during term time.

These expectations are part of our attendance policy, which continues to apply throughout our primary school. We will update you every half-term on your child's attendance.

Did you know?

- All absence, even when authorised due to exceptional circumstances such as illness, affects the amount of time your child spends in Nursery/school and their attendance figure.

What next?



After their one hour visit with a parent or carer, the children will have completed their induction and should continue attending their Nursery sessions every day going forward.

Our first weeks at Nursery have a very strong focus on Personal and Social Education as we all get to know each other and the children learn the rules and expectations of our setting.

Early on in the Autumn Term there will be a 'Meet the Teacher' meeting that we hope you will all be able to attend. This will provide you with more detailed information about how the Nursery sessions run and about our curriculum. It will also give you the opportunity to ask any questions you may have.





School Uniform

Uniform

- Shirt – white or red polo with/without logo
- Trousers or shorts – grey
- Skirt / Pinafore dress – grey
- Summer dress – red/white gingham
- Sweatshirt or cardigan– red with/without school logo
- White, black or grey socks
- Black sensible shoes with heel support and no open toes or plain black trainers (please could these be Velcro rather than lace up)
- Long hair must be tied back (red/grey/black hairband) Clip/bow/headband in red permitted but must be subtle.
- Religious head coverings to be red/grey/black
- Sun hat for warm weather - preferably plain red or black with/without school logo

Additional Equipment



The children will require a PE kit, an all-in-one or two-piece waterproof suit, wellies, a book bag and a water bottle. This is in addition to the basic uniform. Please make sure all items are named!

Once a week, the children will have a PE session and can come to Nursery dressed in their PE kit. We would recommend they wear black jogging bottoms and a black jumper with a t-shirt in their **house team colour**. In warmer weather black shorts and their coloured t-shirt will be sufficient. They will require suitable trainers (not lace ups please.) No-one should wear tights for PE as they will be required to be barefoot for lessons in the hall.

The waterproof suit is for the children to wear in our muddy kitchen, for visiting our Woodlands area and for when it is wet and muddy outside. The waterproof suit can be kept on a dedicated rack at Nursery, as can their wellies.

We ask that children **do not bring rucksacks** to school as these do not fit well on the coat pegs. If your child brings a bag, in addition to their book bag, we ask if it could be a draw-string one please. It is helpful if the children can bring spare clothes to school daily in case they need to be changed.

Please could water bottles be named, and have a drinking spout rather than a screw top lid. We find the latter are easily spilt.



Family Photos

To help the children feel at home when they start Nursery we would love it if you could bring a small family photo in, either on one of your visits, or when they start at Nursery in September. These could also be emailed in to the office.
