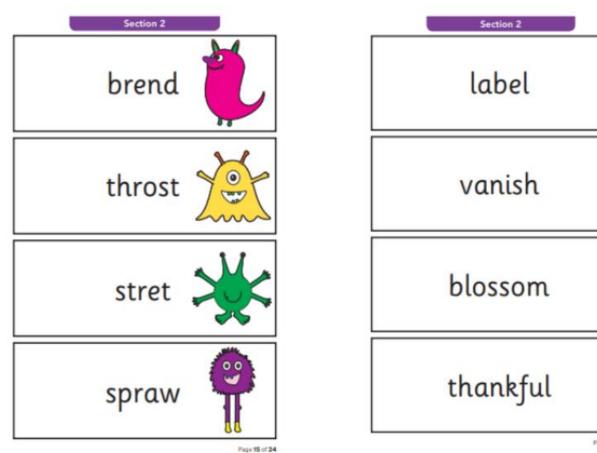

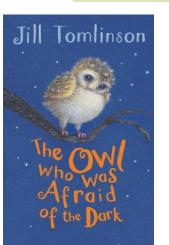


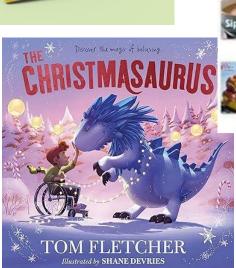
Reading is taught in many ways.

Supporting Reading

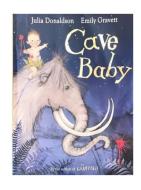


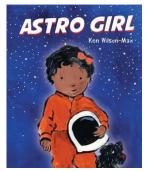
- 1 Monster Phonics book per week (when they are reading it fluently in school).

- Volunteers for Library (1:15ish Monday)

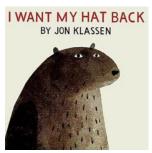


Writing in Year One

We follow Literacy Tree for our writing units. Some of the books we will be using this year:

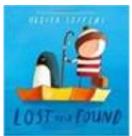

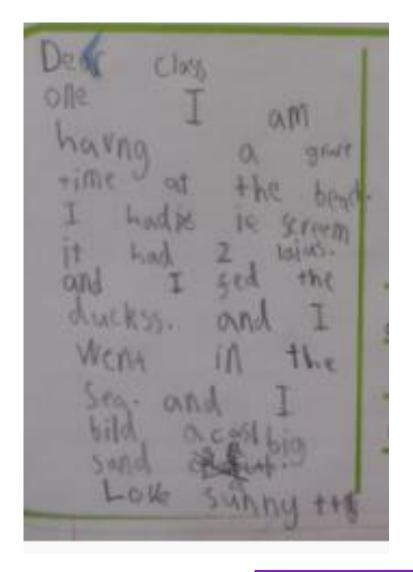

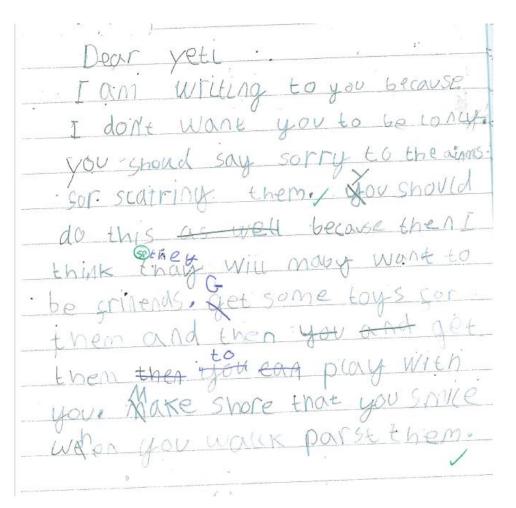
Working at the expected standard

The pupil can, after discussion with the teacher:

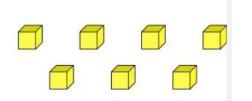
- read own writing aloud clearly for others to hear and discuss
- orally rehearse sentences and sequence them to form short narratives
- · join words and clauses with the conjunction 'and'
- use past, present and future accurately in speech and begin to incorporate these in their writing
- demarcate ≈80% of sentences using a capital letter and a full stop, question mark or exclamation mark
- re-tell and re-write familiar stories, including main events, focusing on characters and settings
- form ≈80% letters and digits correctly, with some difference between upper and lower-case letters
- is beginning to use capital letters on proper nouns (correct ≈20% of the time)
- use spaces between words
- spell ≈80% of tricky red words and the days of the week
- segment spoken words into phonemes and represent these by graphemes spelling words in a phonetically-plausible way











Maths



We follow White Rose Maths

- Numbers to 10, 20 and 100
- Place value
- Counting forwards and backwards, in 2s, 5s and 10s and starting from different points.
- Measuring
- Telling the time o'clock and half past
- Shape 2D and 3D
- Addition and subtraction
- Arrays and groups

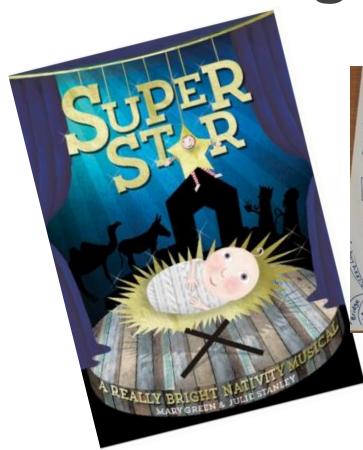

What do children need in school?



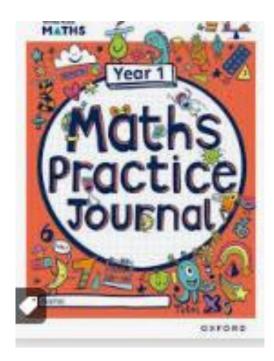
- ❖A named PE kit indoor and outdoor. These will be sent home every half term for washing
- ❖ All hair past shoulder length must be tied up daily
- ❖Stud earrings removed or taped up on PE days. No other jewellery worn to school
- Water bottle (not squash or flavoured water)
- Reading book & record even if not read



Home Learning

No more than 35 minutes a week should be spent on Home Learning tasks.

- Hear your child read- ideally 10 minutes daily. Please record this in their Reading Record.
- Logins can be found in your child's Reading Record.
- Encourage reading of other books
- At least weekly access on Reading Eggs
- Regular use of Numbots
- From half term- up to 6 words to practise spelling.
- Task from White Rose Maths Practice Journal- this will be set on a Friday, to be returned by Wednesday.
